Traditional Camp Programs

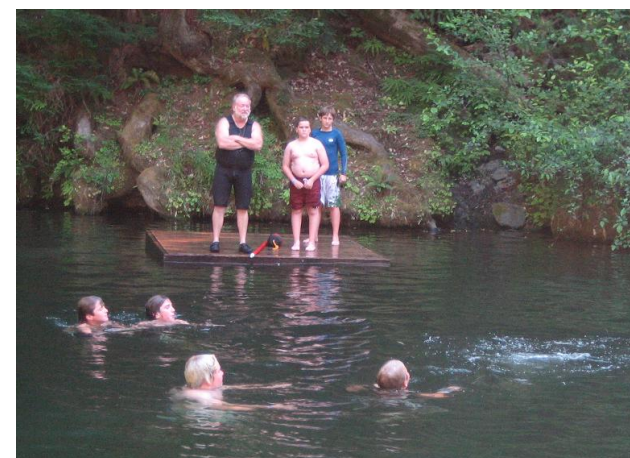
Handicraft: American Heritage, Indian Lore, Basketry, Leatherwork, Wood Carving and more.
